After the successful fundraisers in The Hague and Amsterdam, the next fundraiser will be in Rotterdam. On the 18th of June 2015 the NHF will receive their Friends and relations in the Maritime Museum in Rotterdam, where the Rotterdam naval hero Piet Hein, will be the central character. In name of the Dutch West Indian Company he conquered Salvador de Bahia in 1624 and in 1628 he commanded the ships that captured the Spanish Silver fleet at Cuba. A lecture by Prof.Dr. Henk den Heijer of the University of Leiden will be followed by a guided tour in the museum and our famous cocktail.

Researcher Lodewijk Hulsman just presented his publication on Dutch forts in Brazil which can be seen on the NHF-website. The publication is a fantastic piece of work and will be the base for further Spanish, Portuguese and Brazilian contributions. In the autumn of 2015 local and archaeological information will be collected during a survey in Brazil. The presentation of the coffee-table book of the Atlas of Dutch Brazil is planned for 2016.

For the Atlas of Dutch North America Jaap Jacobs finished his work on the Manhattan and Delaware regions. In cooperation with the New Netherland Institute in Albany, he is now working on the defense works in the Hudson River Valley. The final report is expected to be released coming June.
